- Present SDOCT and FA of patients with DME and PDR illustrating responses to various treatments strategies.
- Review basics of ERG. Provide examples of its diagnostic and therapeutic value.
- Describe indications and techniques for vitreoretinal surgery in patients with posterior uveitis.
- Interpret how intraocular sustained drug delivery devices have been used to treat retinal vascular diseases, and to describe future drug delivery systems currently under development.
- Discuss tips and tricks for microincision vitrectomy surgery.
- Review the drugs in clinical trials and their mechanism of action.
- Discuss advanced management of retinoblastoma.
- Review brachytherapy for malignant melanoma.
- Explore anti-VEGF therapy for management in ocular oncology.
- Explore treatment strategies for subretinal neovascularization in AMD.
- Review diagnostic pearls in infiltrative ocular disease.
- Discuss controversies in retinal detachment repair.
- Review adjunctive treatments for AMD and future new alternatives for this pathology.
- Analyze current surgical treatments and indications for vitrectomy in traction retina detachment and diabetic macular edema.
- Report techniques to maximize the success of macular hole surgery.
- Report the advantages and disadvantages of small-gauge vitrectomy surgery.
